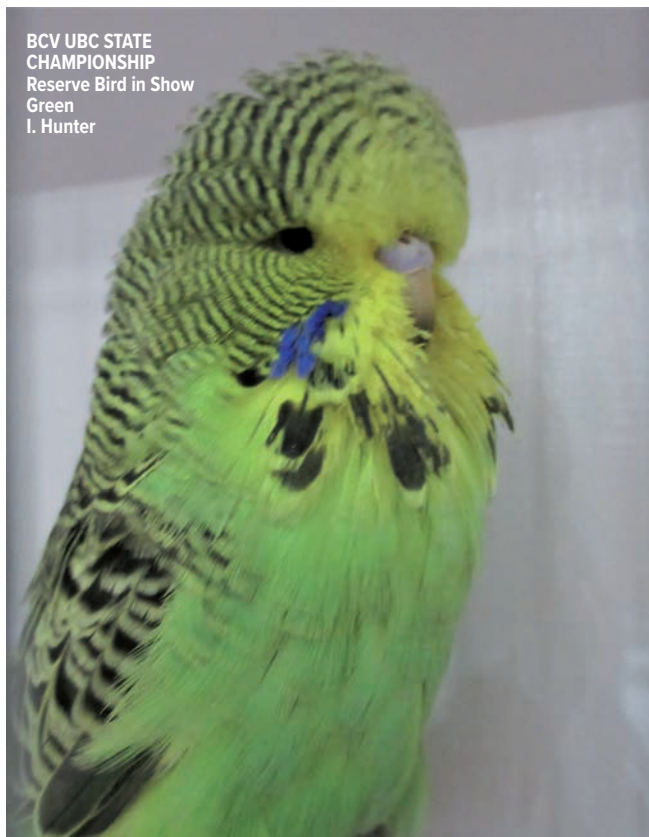

DILUTES.

Although I am not a Dilute breeder, I do breed Dilutes.

Have you noticed there are 4 varieties of Dilutes? Blackeye, Greywing and Clearwing and the imported Grey Yellow/White. When the first Grey yellows arrived, via the Imports in the 90's they were fantastic birds with size, long dense feather and deep masks. Australian breeders had differing ideas on what to do with them and how to treat them, being a new variety to the Australian scene.

Many went down the path of trying to improve the Greywing variety, and with the quality we see now, may have been successful in doing so, but the road was long and bumpy. The Greywing class at shows was riddled with dilutes making them very hard to judge. Some good birds needed to be wrong classed and there was no class for them. Where were breeders supposed to show these, generally, good birds?

Some Blackeye breeders thought they could use them in their Blackeye improvement programs and again there was a small improvement but on the bench these dilutes once again showed up in the Blackeye class, some with Grey factor showing, and were displaced - in most cases as they did not conform to the Blackeye variety. There was a push to add Grey factor to the class which went against the original thinking, the correct "Buttercup" yellow, the original Blackeye variety called for. So again – the Dilute, how does that fit in?

Clearwing breeders found that the dilute was able to 'Clear' up the wings to a point. The biggest issue I see as a 'traditionalist' though, is it is only masking the dark markings on the wing. Are we doing the variety a disservice or are we actually improving the variety? I am dead against the Cinnamonwing into

Clearwings but I am receptive to Dilute if used judiciously. The Clearwing gene is a modified Greywing gene as is the Dilute. Can there be a positive relationship for the Clearwing?

The big break for the Dilute and the other 3 classes above, was when the Dilute was added to the show matrix, even though it was originally known as a Suffused. This Dilute class seemed to be dominated by the "Greywing" and Grey Yellow/White Dilute. The feather and broadness of head of these two particular Dilutes is much more developed, mostly as a result of the fantastic Grey Yellows and Whites which were introduced originally through importation and introduced to the Greywings.

If you look at the birds in the Dilute class you will be able to recognise 3 sub classes,

- a. Blackeye Dilutes or those bred from Blackeyes,
- b. Greywing Dilutes (Grey Yellows/Whites)
- Greywings with poor body colour and poor wing markings and
- c. Clearwing Dilutes which are Clearwings with poor body colour.

The Dilute class has given the breeders of Blackeyes, Greywings and Clearwings a second variety to show whilst trying to improve their respective varieties, and has cleaned up the Variety classes, to some extent, which now only have birds which are representative of their Variety. As long as our Judges keep Wrong Classing birds instead of penalising Dilutes in these classes, we will get to the "Clean Class" breeders of these minor varieties are looking to compete in.

What about Breeders of the Dilute Variety?

I breed dilutes as an offshoot of my minor variety breeding, I do not try to breed Dilutes.

I think it will be important for Dilute breeders out there to decide which of the 4 varieties their Dilutes conform to. If you decide your dilutes need improving, and all dilutes do, you will be doing yourself a disservice if you can't answer these questions;

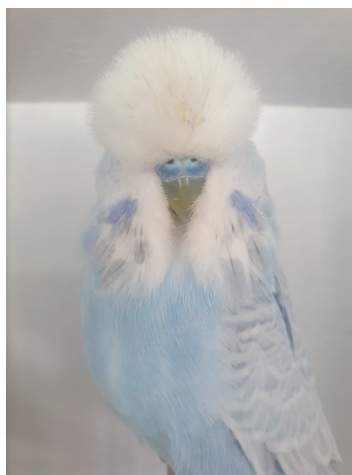
1. What Variety or Varieties of Dilute do I have?
2. Will using a 'different' variety to the one I already have improve my birds?

I see huge challenges for Dilute breeders. Using quality normals to breed splits will be the quickest way forward in breeding quality show stock. I don't see any benefit at all, in crossing different Variety Dilutes to try to affect improvement – but that is just me.

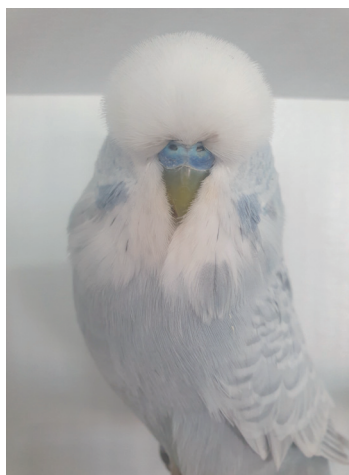

REPORT ON 2022 BCV “HAROLD HEATH” UNBROKEN CAP STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW

As this was the first Unbroken Cap State Championship show post COVID lock-down, with the last one being in 2019, it was eagerly anticipated by many exhibitors. Feedback from many breeders and clubs, prior to the show, indicated a possibly lower than normal turnout of exhibitors and birds due to a variety of reasons. Many exhibitors were experiencing poorer than expected breeding seasons and some of the normally proficient breeders who attend, were on holidays enjoying the post COVID freedom or could not attend for various reasons.

This was also the first State Championship Show at our new venue, Keysborough College – Banksia Campus. As with prior venue changes for the Shield competitions, there are always teething problems that the BCV are required to work through for future events. The key issue from this show was the lighting for some classes and the BCV will work on configuration of the staging across the two basketball courts to minimize issues as experienced at the Unbroken Cap State Championship show. There was great feedback on many aspects of the new venue, including the easy access (apart from two Councillors who managed to have difficulty in finding the venue – possibly a “user problem”), the catering / kitchen setup, the size of the car park – although due to special full moon celebrations our venue was shared on this occasion, easy / much safer access for our staging into / out of the hall, the admin room setup and the safer presentation area for our exhibitors to collect their awards. Whilst not perfect, improvements will be made as we continue to use this venue.

The biggest advantage is that the school is willing to allow the BCV to store our staging trailer plus the marketing trailer and this will make it a more central location for clubs to

take advantage of the staging and marketing trailer for their benefit. The other advantage is that it is significantly cheaper than our previous venue and thus saving money for the BCV.

Clubs may also take up the opportunity to use a relatively cheap centrally located venue with plenty of room for the show and ample car parking.

When all entries had been received there were 636 exhibits entered from 15 clubs. This meant that there were the same number of clubs compared to the last UBC State Championship show (2019) and a decrease of 120 birds or 16% occurred, going from 756 to 636 birds. This was the first time there were less than 700 UBCs benched for a UBC State Championship since 2015 when there were 17 clubs entered compared to 15 clubs this year. The average per club was the same as in 2015 with an average of 42 birds per club entered and well down on 2019 where there were an average of 50 birds per club entered.

Comparing like-for-like versus the last UBC show in 2019 by looking at the average birds entered per club and the average birds entered per class, saw the average birds per class decrease slightly (27 v 23), and the average birds per club decrease significantly (50 v 42). Beginner birds decreased slightly in numbers compared to the Last UBC Show (from 133 to 121) and likewise Intermediate bird numbers were significantly down compared to the Last UBC Show (from 131 to 103). This means that the % reduction of Beginner / Intermediate birds was basically down the same % as the total birds in the show at 15% down compared to the last UBC Show.

The following table shows the last 6 years history of the UBC State Championship Show.

Our newer classes or varieties had mixed results with growing numbers in the Goldenfaced class with 26 entries, the same numbers in the Dark Eyed Clear class with 11 entries, and down slightly with 28 entries in the Whitecap class. The newly introduced Demonstration Rainbow class – now in it's third year in the State Championship show, only managed to have 3 birds from 2 exhibitors entered with a further exhibitor withdrawing on the day with 2 birds entered. Hopefully, we can see more of this wonderful variety at future State Championship shows.

Stewarding is the perfect opportunity to understand the reasons that judges make their decisions and to gain a better understanding of what attributes the judge is looking for in an exhibition budgerigar when it comes to Type and Variety features. It was great to see some new faces, particularly Beginner members volunteering to steward at this event. Multiple stewards being nominated from each club is to be encouraged. Some Beginner members who were worried about stewarding for the first time found the experience very enjoyable, an eye-opening learning experience and not as stressful as expected! Just remember when stewarding, it is the judge who is judging the class and comments should be kept to yourself, unless requested by the judge, until after the class has been completely judged. The reason being is that if you make comments about your bird in the class or future Best

Beginner / Intermediate final, your exhibit may be disqualified for identifying yourself as the exhibitor prior to all judging being completed

As the early classes were completed it was clear that the battle for the top perch was unlikely to be the winner (Mountain Districts) of the last Unbroken Cap State Championship show in 2019. The 2019 runner-up (United) were well ahead of the chasing pack, with the battle for 2nd to 5th places very close. At the 2019 UBC Shield, there was a difference of 153 points between 1st and 2nd but this gap opened up to 206 points the difference this year.

United eventually ran out very easy winners with 745 points (up by 6 on last time). Baw Baw finished second on 539 points and only 5 points ahead of 3rd placed Melton on 534 points. The gap to the 4th placed Mountain Districts on 512 points was only 22 points and only 9 points separated them from the 5th place Riverina on 503 points. Interestingly, of the top 6 clubs this year, 5 of them finished in the Top 6 in 2019 but none of them were in the same position.

To all those clubs striving to improve your results at the State Championship Shows, keep up the good work, it is obviously starting to take effect. The big question being; Can another club challenge the top club in United at the next State Championship show? We will have to wait and see.

There were quite a few changes in positions and improved points scored compared to the last Unbroken Cap State Championship Show in 2019. Four clubs had good increases in points; Eastern Districts (up a massive 191 points and 6 places), Nepean (up 134 points and 3 places), Riverina (up 92 points and up one place) and Geelong (up 88 points and 4 places). A number of clubs had large decreases worth mentioning, namely

Dandenong (down a massive 334 points and 9 places), Mountain Districts (down 244 points and 3 places), Western Suburbs (down 94 points and no places) and Clyde (down 93 points and 1 place).

As can be seen from the above table, the clubs in the top 6 had only one change with Eastern Districts replacing Dandenong but many movements.

The Best Bird in Show went to the Green class winner, exhibited by Jeffrey Leong, with the Reserve Bird in Show going to the Green class runner-up exhibited by Ian Hunter. It was unusual to get two birds from the same class being Best and Reserve Birds in the show but it just goes to show how strong the Green class was.

The most important thank-you goes to Con Herouvim for storing the BCV staging plus organizing delivery (any payment for!) the staging to land at the venue, plus Ray Slade for moving the trailer to its temporary new home on the grass. Many of these people go unnoticed but we could not deliver a successful State Championship Show without their help – thanks again!

Remember that in the future we need to head the saying “many hands make light work”, so at the next State Championship Show don’t just stand around “supervising” – pitch in and help setup and pack the staging away.

REPORT ON 2022 BCV UBC STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW BEGINNER & INTERMEDIATE

Beginner and Intermediate exhibitors putting their birds up against the Open and Champion section exhibitors is sometimes seen as daunting by many Beginner and Intermediate exhibitors. The quality birds benched by these exhibitors at the 2022 BCV Unbroken Cap State Championship Show across many varieties was sensational. Not only were they competitive against fellow Beginner and Intermediate exhibitors, but they were also competitive against the Open and Champion exhibitors. Beginner or Intermediate exhibitors won 8 of the 28 classes for the day – a fantastic achievement that shows that they will soon be promoted!

Most clubs are now used to the entry procedure for Beginner/Intermediate birds. A reminder - if the Beginner / Intermediate birds are in the selected 3 club birds, then no additional entry is required. You must carefully identify these

birds as Beginner/Intermediate exhibitor birds to ensure they are included in the special awards.

Out of the total of 636 birds at the Young Bird State Championship, there were 121 Beginner birds and 103 Intermediate birds entered. These were a good proportion of birds benched and based on the excitement shown by these exhibitors, the BCV Council will continue including the format in future events. They always were part of the team but are now clearly identified due to the Special Beginner and Intermediate Awards.

Congratulations to all those exhibitors lucky enough to be rewarded with the Special Award medal on the day and also to those who participated in the State Championship Show for the first time.

Great to see the winners proudly displaying their medals after the show and also via social media.

The rules are simple. Place the eight birds that follow in order from 1st place to 8th place as you believe that they would finish on the show bench.

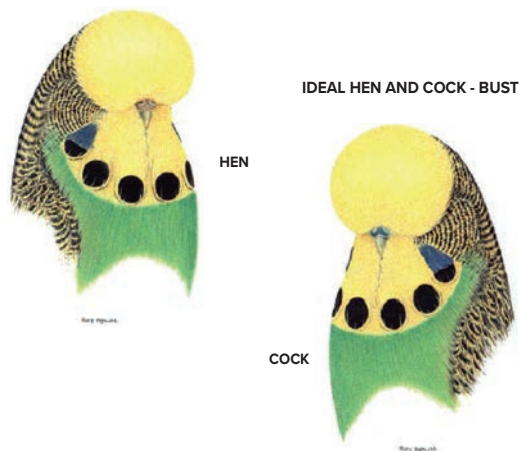

Entries must be in by the 25th November 2022.

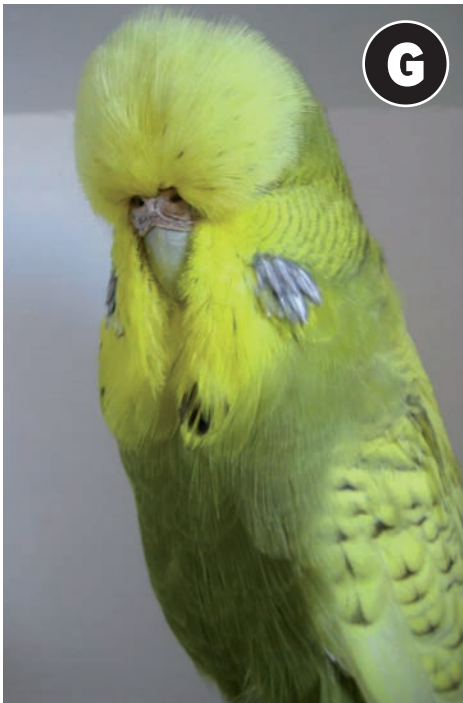

JUDGING COMPETITION RESULTS FROM LAST EDITION OF BUDGIE NEWS

Judge's comments by Rod Turnbull as follows;

1st Place: D – Goldenfaced Violet Cock

Big, long, strong bird with good directional feathering, combined with a lovely set of spots. Lovely deep mask. Nice outline with plenty of top skull, back skull and frontal feather lift. Solid variety bird, showing plenty of the required blue colouring.

2nd Place: G – Goldenfaced Sky Hen

A big strong bodied hen with plenty of width of shoulder and a strong top end. Nice facial features, with a deep mask, width of face, directional feather and plenty of back skull. Best bird in the class but penalised for colour and variety compared to the first bird with more green in the body and yellow markings in the wings.

3rd Place: B – Goldenfaced Violet Cock

Has nice lift above the cere & shows directional feathering, this rolls down past the cere & back up above the eye. Colour slightly lighter than the birds above. He shows nice depth of mask.

4th Place: C – Goldenfaced Sky Cock

Another solid bodied bird with nice facial features. Good feather direction over the eyes and nice cap release / blow. Excellent variety bird with solid blue body colour and almost perfect white wing markings. He is not quite as strong in mask and spots compared to those above but still a lovely example of the variety required.

5th Place: E – Goldenfaced Cobalt Hen

The best variety bird in the class with vibrant buttercup yellow face, solid blue body colour and nice white markings in the wings. A strong bodied bird that lacks the length of feather and facial features in comparison to those ahead of her. Slight flecking also detracts from the bird, although very minor

6th Place: H – Goldenfaced Cobalt Cock

A nice long bird with good length of mask and a solid set of spots. Lovely lift of cap right through the back skull to the cere. A good variety bird but lacks the feather direction and width of face to be placed higher.

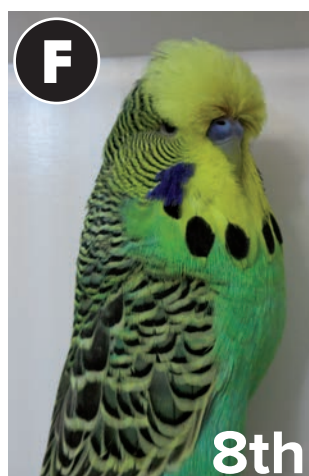
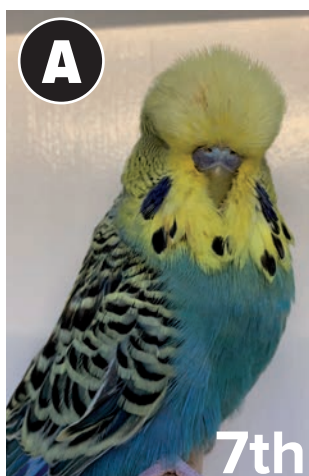
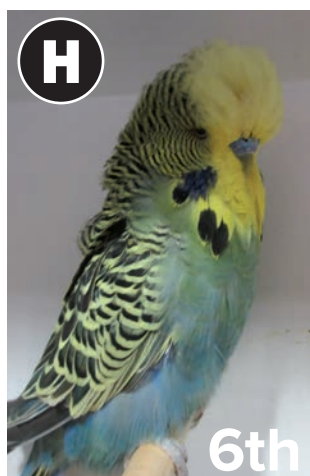
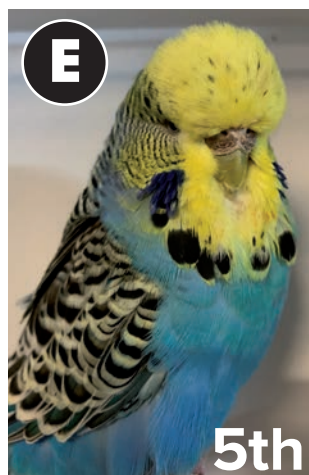
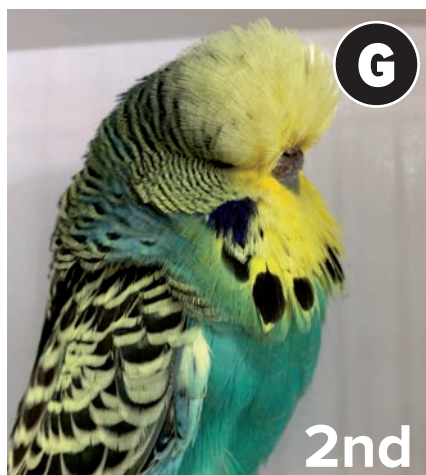
7th Place: A - Goldenfaced Violet Cock

A smaller sized bird with neat features. Small spots, short mask and limited facial features, along with size and strength lacking compared to other birds in the class. Lovely variety bird with good body colour, nice buttercup yellow face and reasonable wing markings.

8th Place: F – Goldenfaced Sky Cock




Strong bodied bird with lovely spots and mask. Nice feather direction and in excellent condition. Unfortunately, this bird needs to be disqualified due to being of 'sea green' colour instead of the required 'blue' as per the Penalties and Disqualifications Clauses in the Standard. These birds should be used only for breeding and not put on the show bench.

There was no winning entrant from last edition received.

(THESE GUIDELINES ARE SET AND MAINTAINED BY THE ANBC JUDGES PANEL, WHO RETAIN SOLE OWNERSHIP OF THE CONTENT

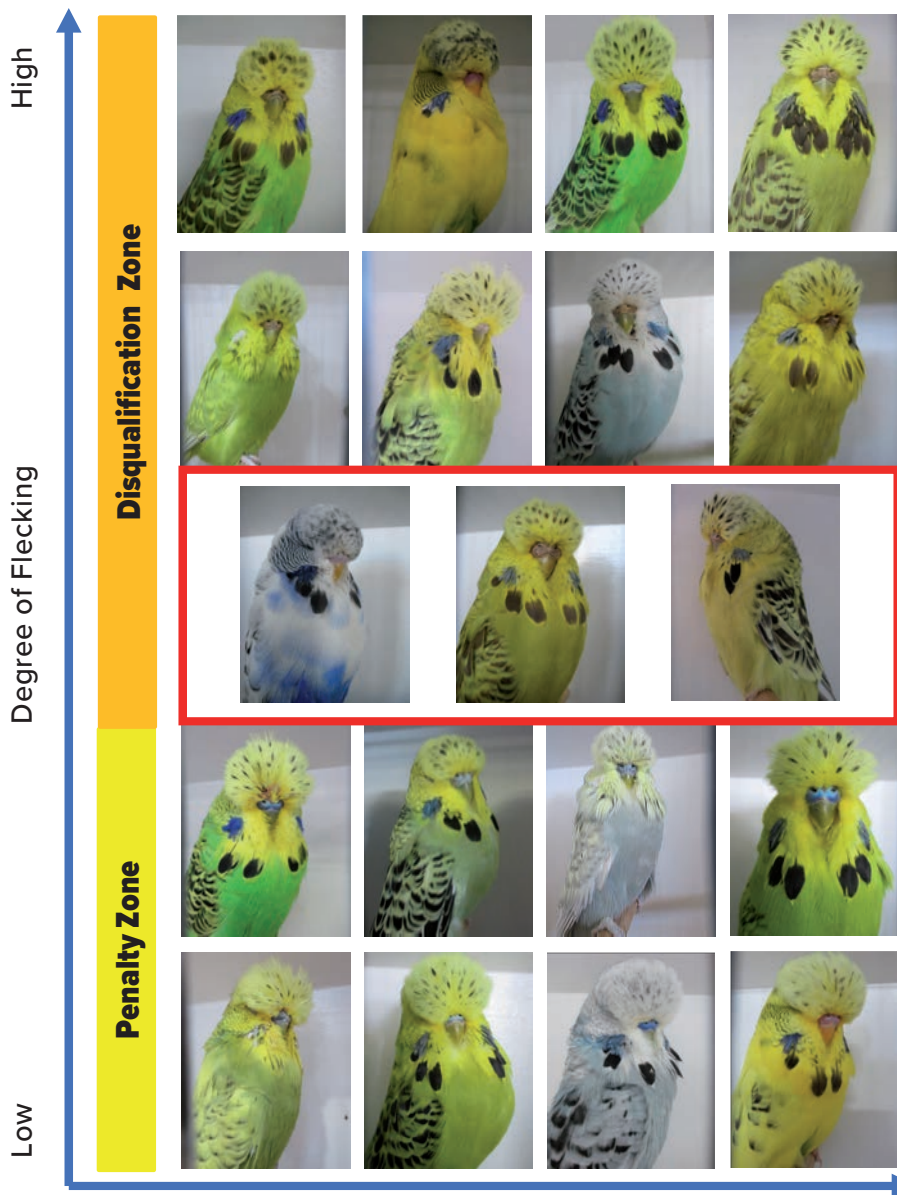
The above is an extract from the current ANBC Standard Penalty and Disqualification clauses relating the Head Flecking.

The BCV hopes that this information helps exhibitors understand the rationale judges are using for the determination as to how to judge a bird with flecking. It should also help exhibitors determine which birds will be accepted on the show bench, which ones will

be penalised and ultimately help the breeder build and select their show team.

Please be accepting of the judge's decision, as there will be many reasons as to selecting or not selecting certain exhibits over other exhibits on the day, including different interpretations of The Standard Penalty and Disqualification clauses and their application.

ROD TURNBULL Q&A

BCV COUNCILOR AND STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW SECRETARY

1. What is the history behind you getting into exhibition budgerigars and what official positions have you held?

a. My mother bred and showed budgies back in the 1970s. She sold out a couple of years after being promoted to Open status as she enjoyed winning prizes and couldn't compete, as she put it, "with the big boys" in Open status. I decided to start in the hobby a couple of years after she sold out with a small cobbled together bird room built on a floor made from bessa blocks against the side of the house. I had 4 breeding cages and 10 birds with only one bird bred in my first year.

b. My first breeding year was 1980 but I didn't become more serious about showing until the mid 1980s.

c. I have since been on committee and President at both my original club (Western Suburbs) and my current club (Eastern Districts). I am honoured to be a Life Member of Western Suburbs.

d. I have also been a BCV Councillor for over 20 years (including Vice President for around 10 years) plus Show Secretary for the BCV State Championship (formally the Shield) shows since September 2002. With COVID, judging (James and myself at National) plus one missed due to being interstate, it is around 50 BCV State shows all up.

2. Who has been the greatest help to you and in which ways?

a. Obviously, my mother in the early days, then one of the founding fathers of my original club (Western Suburbs) in

Melbourne, a man called Jack Watts. He was larger than life (a big man, even when older in years) and would share much budgie wisdom, especially to "youngsters" in the hobby. Along the journey there have been many people who have assisted me with expanding my knowledge. As Jack Watts once said "he had been in birds for 50 years and was learning new things every year", so a lot of people have helped me. Another person who assisted both James and myself in the hobby and a key reason (apart from my move) in joining Eastern was Rob Davis. Rob not only imparted his knowledge of breeding and showing good budgies but also assisted both of us greatly in becoming judges.

3. What is the best part of the hobby that you enjoy the most?

a. The best part of the hobby is the social aspect and this can be achieved in many ways. One way is to provide feedback to exhibitors after you judge the birds – this is both informative to the exhibitor to assist in guidance to decisions on the day but also gives me information from specialist breeders of certain varieties to better understand the particular variety. A great example of this is when the BCV introduced the Rainbow class and I had the honour of being able to judge the class and then chat to exhibitors after judging. After judging, the next most enjoyable part, is taking photos of birds at shows. This enables me to provide images to various magazines, the National results booklet and my wife to complete drawings for breeders who want a permanent piece to remind them

of their prize-winning budgie.

4. I believe you have a partnership with James Bader. Explain how it works and what have been your achievements on the show bench?

a. James and myself (plus technically my son Patrick – hence the ring code JRP) have been in partnership for around 20 years. We were friends before that at Western Suburbs club, as he was Show Manager / Vice President whilst I was President, with both on committee for many years. We joined in partnership when we left Western Suburbs to join Eastern Districts. We both keep our own breeding setups with occasional sharing of birds. Mostly it is a 'showing partnership' but we do try to feed similar products and seed to our birds.

b. We have some varieties that we each specialise in outside what we call dominant / normal varieties. James has Recessive Pies plus Clearbodies and I have Dilutes, Goldenfaced, Fallows (minimal) plus Dark Eyed Clears. James runs around 16 breeding cages and I run around 27 breeding cages in our own individual setups.

c. My favourites come partly from my mother, who loved the Goldenfaced, plus my interest in the genetics side, so I also enjoy Dark Eyed Clears and the challenge of Dilutes from variety aspect.

d. The variety that I have managed to build into a consistently strong performer on the show bench is Dilutes. The latest from a solid history of high finishes at the BCV Shields was a 2nd place at

the Adelaide 2022 Nationals. This line originated from an original pair that was a Vic Murray Opaline Dilute hen and a Derek Poole Dilute Sky cock bird. Goldenfaced have also been successful with two Shield wins plus the inaugural Variety Challenge Certificate for that variety.

e. Other successes have been 9 Shield wins, 3 Diplomas, a handful of Variety Challenge Certificates and a number of National team birds over the years. The first Shield class was as an individual in 1996 with a Lacewing UBC and the latest was in 2022 with Adult Goldenfaced. Our first Diploma was Sale Diploma in 2005 with a Recessive Pied.

5. What is the feeding programme you implement for your birds?

a. I am somewhat a traditionalist - my philosophy is to try to keep to natural feed products and avoid too many medicinal / synthetic foods. I feed a basic seed mix (Budgie Vic Gold from Eastern Distributors) with added some grey sunflower seeds (no oats apart from breeding cages when feeding chicks). I add some millet sprays for chicks, from late nest box age to weaning cage. A variety of vegetables daily and some added protein mixtures into the diet. Vegetables that I feed include; Carrots, Silverbeet, Celery, Endive and Kale with some occasional fruits such as apples, oranges and lemons thrown in. Aviaries and breeding cages both get the vegetables, with carrots a mainstay being almost daily. Calcium blocks in both aviaries and breeding cages (I don't

use cuttlefish as I feel it can harbour issues when collected from the beach and birds often just chew it for fun). A block of red rock salt in all aviaries is a recent addition. The added protein comes in the form of a horse mix by Hygain called Stud Torque and a powder by International Animal Health Products (IAHP) called Livamol. Both contain molasses that some people frown upon but I have had not troubles and used the Livamol for many years and the Stud Torque for the last couple of years.

6. Do you use anything in the water?

- a. Again, pretty basic, with plain water alternated with some water additives under no set plan. The additives that I use are; Aviclenz (water cleanser), Soluvet D Breeder (vitamins and minerals) and Immunity Plus (natural herb based product to assist with immunity and stress in birds from Hilton Herbs).

7. You have been a very valuable asset to the National Show over quite a number of years with the beautiful photography of the winning birds – how difficult is it to take photographs and what is the secret because I take terrible photos?

- a. I have been lucky enough to get up close to the winning birds in each class at the Nationals since Busselton in 2008 and only missed Brisbane in 2019 due to judging. I thoroughly enjoy being able to get to see the placegetters up close and straight after judging to take photos to share. I take photos that can be enjoyed by not only the local Australian exhibitors and enthusiasts but also the rest of the world – thanks to the expanded global

interest as a result of Luke Fletcher's IT expertise. Many people think that it is a holiday going to the National Show but I generally take around 2000 photos over the weekend with around 20 of each bird plus presentation photos. I don't get much time to socialise during the day or watch the judging over the weekend but it is worth the hard work when you see the results and can share our wonderful budgies with the world. The key to taking good photos is to take a lot of them! This way you can almost always guarantee some of them will be good ones. Quantity is important but you also need a great deal of patience and I think being a judge helps to get the best representation from a judge's perspective, rather than just a 'snap shot'.

8. You judged the National in Brisbane in 2019. What was this experience like and what got you into first of all, State judging and then National judging?

- a. It was a wonderful experience and I thank SQBBA for the invitation. I need to thank my partner for the weekend, Roy Blair, for his friendship and wisdom as we forged our way through the classes in Brisbane. When judging I believe that we need to share what we see as we judged the birds and the National provides that exact vehicle as judges explain the classes after judging. This way exhibitors can, even if they disagree, get the reasons for the decisions made in finalising the placings.

9. How do you think we can encourage fanciers into the hobby and keep the ones we have?

a. My personal view is that we need to make it easier to people to be part of the many clubs we have across the country. These members do not always need to be members striving to win a National but can just be 'budgie lovers'. Clubs need to not only provide an avenue for members to show birds (and win a National if you are lucky enough!) but also to foster members who may never want to even put a bird on the bench. These members might want to enjoy the social side of being able to chat about budgies with like-minded people or be more interested in breeding the 'pretty colours' or 'bush budgies'. Sometimes they may wish to show these 'non-Standard quality' birds but many times they may not. This is something that I learnt from talking to some of the Rainbow breeders that attended our State Championship show in May. Some people may not see it this way but you don't only breed budgies to win a National. Many people own pet budgies who might just want to talk about budgies and socialise at a club night, especially the older people who may have limited social opportunities when it comes to their birds.

10. Anything else you would like to comment on?

a. We have a wonderful National Competition and it would be a shame if we could not continue to have this show rotating around the 7 Zones in the future. We need to put personalities and politics aside and come up with "solutions" as to how we can continue to run the show in its current format. The

strategy should be HOW can we do it and not try to find excuses by saying it CANNOT be done. There is a National leadership that needs to support Zones in doing whatever it takes to continue, be that money, resources or people and all Zones need to assist each other where possible to make this happen. There is currently an almost standard Administration team table plus IT plus photographer, so it would not be difficult to expand this team further to assist in other areas as required.
